


THANKFUL FOR A TEAM



Typically, on a good day, we see an average of 25 children in the gym. During the afternoon we play lots of group games (to wear off their energy!), followed by a devotional time. We have had some weeks when the devotional time was very hard because of the children's lack of attention. Continue to pray that God would be honored, and that the children would take something away from the Bible teaching.






Re - Energizer
