Dining Hall Update

We are excited to announce that our Dining Hall/Chapel project is COMPLETE and was wrapped up as a capital project at the end of December 2023!

While the planning and clearing had started months before, construction officially began on June 29, 2020 when Calvin and Riley rolled in with their equipment and started digging the foundation. Now, this last December, 2023 we have a complete, beautiful building to remind us of how God provides and His faithfulness.

We want to thank each person who has prayed for and supported PRBC throughout this huge project! We want to send out a huge thank you to our Father in heaven for providing in so many ways for this building and for making all the details come together.





NEW CABIN: We are hoping to construct a new cabin this spring. The new cabin will allow us to have 4 cabins on the girl's side and 4 cabins on the boy's side. The cabin will be roughly 18 x 22 feet, allowing us to sleep 10 people inside. This cabin will also have a loft space and will be heated with a wood stove.

ASPEN RENOVATIONS:

This renovation is tentatively scheduled to take place in the latter part of March 2024. The renovations include new flooring in all three bedrooms, new windows upstairs, a new deck accessible from the upstairs living room, new tin roof, new siding on all four outside walls, new light fixtures inside, and a fresh coat of paint upstairs.

SPEAKERS CABIN: This is a much smaller project and will only get completed if the above two projects are finished. We hope to renovate one of our buildings into a small speaker's cabin to allow our speakers to have a place that is quiet to prepare their lessons. We will be utilizing some of the windows that we are taking out of Aspen to brighten up the building and will be installing an electric A/C heater unit the camp already owns to keep the building a nice temperature, which should allow our speakers to get a good night's sleep.
