LIT stands for Leader In Training and is designed to bring back the Teen and Junior Teen campers and show them what it's like to take on different responsibilities around the camp and to further prepare them into cabin leading.

A crew from Manor came out for a weekend to help clean up the camp and get Sparrow off to a great start. Bruce, Michael, and Calvin worked on the cabin pretty regularly after that. At the start of week 1

of summer camp Sparrow was approaching completion. Bruce worked on Sparrow while Calvin and Michael helped with summer camp. With Scamper week being a quiet week, Michael and Calvin were able to help Bruce complete the cabin building. Some Interior work included new to a point of useability. Sparrow Cabin was used for the last 3 remaining weeks of camp. The new cabin measures 18x28 the 28 is including a 6 foot one who came and helped on this project! deck. Sparrow is 630 sq feet.


